### **An Introduction About You**

I'm a disability/diversity activist/campaigner/public speaker, writer, blogger, trainer, passionate believer in inclusion and advocate for social justice which is at the core of my business model as a director of Pandora Inc CIC which stands for: Promoting Achievement Nurturing Diversity Openly Respecting Ability. As a disabled professional, I have had over 30 years in the social welfare and criminal justice field both as a Social Worker and Senior Probation Officer. I engage with many diverse audiences sharing my dynamic approach to life with optimism and a dry sense of humour. My approach is totally inclusive and is at the core of my business model for Pandora Inc CIC, which was set up to work with those on the margins of society and give a voice to the voiceless.

### **Your Priorities and Focuses**

My priority and main focus is always on those who are not well represented within the community. I am always in favour of the under dog! I want to see us build back better from the pandemic and I will be working towards White Ribbon Accreditation for the Town Council as well as listen to my constituents about their needs and concerns.

I am the disability representative on the Independent Advisory Group to the Police in Milton Keynes, and a member of Soroptimists MK who strive to promote and improve the quality of life for women and girls. I am also part of the CommsTeam in the Womens Equality Party MK. I am also a member of the Disability Caucus for the national Womens Equality Party where I have recently designed a new disability awareness course. I am also a Community Representative on the Assessment Board of the local Community Foundation which allocates funds to local third sector organisations. I have also recently submitted two chapters for publication in two separate books.

Refurbishment works have taken place at Fenny Stratford Community Centre over the last few months. The Town Council initially undertook repairs to the fabric of the building to prevent further deterioration and following this has completed a full refurbishment to the inside of the building which had become tired and dated.

The Community Centre has received new paintwork throughout, new toilets, new kitchen, new flooring, new doors and skylights, new security features and door access control system, new furniture and has had the original parquet flooring in the main hall lifted, sanded and re-laid. The building is much improved and feels much more modern and inviting and is ready to host events, community groups, parties and all manner of activities and bookings.

We celebrated the reopening of the Community Centre on 18th September with tea and cake with local residents, councillors, staff and the Mayor of Milton Keynes and we are very excited to invite bookings going forward at very competitive prices. ## Rangers Report Update

The summer is a particularly busy time for the Rangers who have been engaged in lots of outside maintenance. They have spent time mowing, strimming and hedge trimming at our Larch Grove allotment site and in the areas surrounding Newton Leys Pavilion. The Rangers have also been busy planting, watering and maintaining our planters in the town centre, at the front of the library and our new planter at the front of our offices at Bletchley Library.

The Rangers continue to report and clear rubbish and waste from all around our area and regularly litter pick areas identified as needing it.

The growing season at the allotments has seen our sites at Newton Leys, Larch Grove, Manor Fields and Orchardside full of activity, life and vigour. Many of the new plots at Newton Leys are already incredibly well established and our new tenants there are enjoying the fruits of their hard work. The Rangers have been busy conducting their inspection regime which highlights plots which are not being so well looked after. When this is the case tenants are given a period of time to improve their plots and failing that, the plots are taken back and re-let to those on our waiting list. Please get in contact if you would like to put your name down for a plot when one is available.

The Community Orchard in Manor Fields is looking great with many of the apple trees laden with fruit ready to be picked when ripe in late September/October (you can tell if an apple is ripe if it comes off easily from the tree when you twist the stalk and if inside the pips are brown). The work conducted early in the year by specialist contractors has really paid off and we invite the community to share in this bumper crop. Please only take what you need so that the crop can be enjoyed by as many of our residents as possible. We look forward to seeing your pictures and hearing what you have made with your apples.

In addition to outside works, the Rangers have been invaluable completing repairs and maintenance at our buildings such as Newton Leys Pavilion, Fenny Stratford Community Centre, Spotlight and the Public Toilets on Albert Street which have sadly been vandalised a number of times in recent months.









## News from St Frideswide's

# New Artwork - Alphonso by Sarah Staton

A new commission by artist Sarah Staton, 'Alphonso' is a three-sided sculpture which includes a decorative archway and seating area, overlooking the beautiful environment around Willow Lake. Sarah has taken inspiration from local heritage, particularly the former brickworks, 'Alphonso' is built from bespoke and handmade brick elements, including the fish slips and glazed sections. The blue and white tiles are hand-painted by Sarah and depict the local area, its wildlife and history.

The build is now complete and a series of final remedial works to the mound are being undertaken by Taylor Wimpey, before full access to 'Alphonso' is possible.

A celebration of the new artwork took place recently where residents met the artist and learnt more about the artwork.
