Message from our Chair

Written before the Annual Meeting of Full Council in May 2022

Dear Resident.

I am immensely sad to let you know that one of our Councillors – Cllr Amanda Carter-Philpott passed away very recently. On 24 May 2022, our Councillors paid their final respects and gave thanks for her at an extraordinary council meeting. I would invite you to read the council's tribute on page 4. Amanda was an amazing councillor who put her community first, and her passing is a very big loss indeed.

Our community has many people here that do amazing and inspirational things but receive little credit, and we as a Council want to recognise these brilliant people. I am pleased to let you know we will be having our first PRIDE of Bletchley and Fenny Stratford Awards this year. Nominations will be accepted until 17 June 2022 and can be submitted online via our website or by completing a paper form which is available to collect from the Town Council's office, Sycamore House.

I presided over my first Annual Meeting of Electors on 12 May 2022 at Fenny Stratford Community Centre and presented to the community our annual report and accounts. Residents were invited to ask any questions of the council. Questions raised included the level of attendance of members at meetings, parking within Central Bletchley and questions about our finances. It was pleasing that so many of you think we are doing a good job as a Council. Our members are all volunteers and whilst the law permits us to offer a small allowance, none of our Councillors have elected to take this up.

During our April full council meeting, our Council took the decision to directly manage landscaping services from April 2023. This will mean that the majority of the green space with Bletchley and Fenny Stratford (excluding anything private managed or considered to be part of housing revenue account land) currently looked after by Serco on behalf of Milton Keynes Council will be directly managed by us. This was one of the things that your deemed to be important in our recent resident survey and it is aligned to our strategic priority of "getting things done".

We installed a new publicly accessible defibrillator (PAD) on the side of the Irish Centre in Manor Fields. The PAD has been provided by the Town Council following discussions with the MK Irish Football Team who play on the pitch at the Irish Club. The Irish Club kindly allowed us to mount this on their wall and provide the electric for the heated defibrillator cabinet. We will continue to install more as part of a programme over the council term.

After a really successful start to have more specialist markets in Bletchley, we will be having another Food & Craft market on Saturday 25 June. Bletchley Vegan Market returns on Saturday 16 July and on Saturday 30 July, we will have our first Bletchley Street Eat - a celebration of Bletchley's diversity and culture. Entertainment, music, games, food and drink all taking place on Queensway.

I look forward to seeing you soon.

Emporium MK is a new addition to Queensway. It is an alternative boutique on Bletchley high street, with crystals, incense, handmade gifts, jewellery, bath bombs and more. The shop is one of the success stories of our high street and gains new, loyal customers week on week. Pippa and Victoria co-own the store, having known each other for 15 years. Together, they combined Pippa's extensive knowledge of alternative products and Victoria's vast retail experience to create Emporium MK.

Starting off in an upstairs unit with just a doorway leading to their store, although they were steadily growing, they have now moved to 86 Queensway, with double fronted window displays. The business has thrived since opening in their new location, with just two days to move all their stock over, they enlisted the help of friends and suppliers. Co-Owner Victoria said "We were in our original shop for 7 months and although it was a great starting point, we were missed by passersby. We had the opportunity to move to a new shop and now we have new customers every day who come into the store who didn't know we existed! It's great we can now display lots of products from our independent businesses."

Emporium MK works on the concept of selling shelf space and is currently helping over 30 small business sell their wares. Along with providing a platform for independent businesses, they have created a community with regular social meets up for likeminded people to connect. The store has also been used for yoga classes and meditation sessions.

Branching out from the shop, The Wellness Hub is an alternative medicine practice, offering reiki and massages as well as beauty treatments located at the back of the shop. Co- Owner Pippa said "To be able to offer these increasingly popular services to the local area is really fulfilling. People are looking for ways to enrich their lives and feel better mentally and spiritually in the current world we live in."

Emporium MK attended our first Food and Craft Market earlier this year and they are returning to our market on 25th June. Pippa and Victoria try and get to as many local markets as possible to promote their store, working tirelessly to support the small businesses that supply their store.

Notes from the Clerk's desk



The council team has been busy with "business as usual" and the delivery of our Spring 2022 programme of activities and events. Following on from these and the recent Jubilee celebrations, we are now completing arrangements for our specialist markets in June and July and of course our new Bletchley Big Street Eat event which we hope will bring the community together for food and fun in the centre of Bletchley. With the UEFA Women's EURO 2022 football matches and associated activities at Stadium MK in July, and the annual Canal Festival and Fenny Poppers event in August 2022, there should be no shortage of things to do in Bletchley this summer.

Meanwhile your councillors continue to make decisions and act on behalf of the community. One of the most important recent decisions has been that, following feedback from our 2022 survey, the Council has decided to take over direct delivery of grass cutting and landscape maintenance of open space and amenity land in Bletchley and Fenny Stratford including the Blue Lagoon and Leon Recreation Ground from April 2023. This service is currently delivered by a large contractor appointed by Milton Keynes Council. There will be more information about this in future newsletters but if you would like to ask any questions about this

please do contact us.

The evidence collected from this year's survey will help the council make future decisions and set relevant priorities. But the council is very keen to hear from residents all year round. All council meetings are open to the public and our office at Sycamore House, Drayton Road is open daily if you would like to talk to a council officer. Annual Survey Results Summary

Thank you to all residents who completed our annual survey. We received nearly one thousand responses in total. Several key themes came through and important issues were raised. These included the need for regeneration of our town centres, concerns about the closure of Sainsburys and existing local retail options, traffic and speeding, parking, and community safety. Another insight from the survey is that we need to increase awareness of Town Council's services, buildings and responsibilities.

Your responses will inform the work of the Town Council, and our work with partner organisations in the future. The full survey results are available to view on our website: www.bletchleyfennystratford-tc.gov.uk . Please see below for the Town Council's position on some of the key issues:

- Regeneration of Bletchley and Fenny high streets the Town Council is working with Milton Keynes Council and the Bletchley & Fenny Town Deal to try to secure improvements but significant inward investment is needed. Many residents are upset about the loss of Sainsburys. Unfortunately, this store was closed for commercial reasons. High streets everywhere are changing and 57% of our respondents said they do most of their shopping online or in other places than the local shops. Residents said that having more events would breathe life into Queensway and encourage them back into the town centre so the Council has planned eleven events during 2022 to attract footfall. We are collaborating with Milton Keynes Council and the Bletchley and Fenny Town Deal with the projects in the Town Deal investment plan which will support the high streets and local businesses.
- Litter and fly tipping 74% of respondents felt there was big problem with litter and the Town Council will continue working with Milton Keynes Council and the volunteer community to try to tackle this more effectively as well as providing dog and litter bins.
- Grass cutting and landscape maintenance nearly 60% of respondents wanted to see the Town Council take on landscaping responsibilities. The plans have now been put in place for this with delivery beginning in April 2023
- Community safety 37% of respondents felt there was an issue with crime in their area and 40% of respondents felt there was a problem where they live with anti-social behaviour. The Town Council will continue to support community safety measures such as provision of CCTV and will keep working with the local TVP community policing team. We will also support community resilience by working with partner organisations and providing grants for community groups.

Electra Community Canal Boat Update by Jane Wolfson - Volunteer Chair

In May 2021 the new community boat Electra was launched onto the Grand Union canal in Milton Keynes at Willowbridge. Volunteers from the Bedford & Milton Keynes Waterway Trust then spent two busy months equipping the boat and crew, with financial support from Bletchley & Fenny Stratford Town Council and others.

By July Electra was ready for summer cruising! In a short first season, with limited numbers of guests on board due to the ongoing pandemic, Electra still ran 189 cruises carrying 1,250 guests. This enabled the community boat to pay all its costs, without the need for further support.

Everyone welcome

Trust volunteers aim to offer enjoyable experiences on the water for all, to build local support for the proposed Bedford & Milton Keynes Waterway Park.

Electra has hosted people from every local MK postcode on board, and they are certainly enjoying it - in an online Guest Survey, over 90% of guests rated the volunteer crew as very friendly; over 90% would recommend Electra to others; and 95% are likely/very likely to book again.

Electra is all-electric, takes 12 guests, and has an access lift and toilet on board, so it's quiet and comfortable for everyone. You can find out more on the website www.bmkwaterway.org/electra/, on social media @ElectraBoatMK, or pop into the Town Council office for a leaflet.

To do this it needs a place to charge overnight, and a bookable mooring space. The Electra team are working with Willowbridge Marina, the Canal & River Trust and the Town Councils so that hopefully you will see Electra more often in 2023.

Support available from Citizens Advice MK

Citizens Advice Milton Keynes is a local charity that has been supporting the residents of Milton Keynes for 50 years, we help thousands of people every year with many different problems. We support people to solve a variety of issues involving family, money, and legal problems.

Sometimes problems like these can make you feel unwell or make an existing condition even worse, worrying about things like debt and your housing situation can have a real impact on your sleep and day to day life. Whilst GPs can help you with your health, they can't help you with Claiming Universal Credit or PIP and they also cannot prevent you from being evicted or provide support for your debt issues.

Bletchley and Fenny Stratford Town Deal Update







Groundbreaking Bletchley & Fenny

As you may be aware, the government has approved a multi-million pound investment plan for Bletchley and Fenny Stratford which will bring major improvements to the area. The Bletchley and Fenny Stratford Town Deal Board was established in July 2020 to prepare the investments plan and oversee the approval and delivery of the various improvement projects.

During March 2022, the Town Deal Board considered the business cases for the 9 Town Deal projects for approval. Once agreed by the Board, the business cases have to be agreed by Milton Keynes Council's chief financial officer and then sent to the Government for the approval and release of funding. All approvals need to be in place before work can start on the ground.

In preparing the business cases, further work has been undertaken to ensure that the projects are viable and deliver good value for money. The Town Deal Board has now approved the business cases for the majority of the projects, including the new redway links from Newton Leys and the Lakes Estate to Central Bletchley; improvements at Bletchley Park; the public realm improvements; continuing the roll-out of fibre broadband and the Revolving Development Fund. Further work is being carried out on business cases for a couple of other projects and these will be considered by the Board shortly.


