PUBLIC NOTICE

THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF MILTON KEYNES (DRAYTON ROAD (PART), BLETCHLEY) (TEMPORARY CLOSURE) ORDER 2021

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Borough of Milton Keynes intends, in not less than seven days from the date of this Notice, to make the above Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit vehicles from entering, waiting or proceeding along the following length of road in order to carry out installation of fence to pilasters to mitigate jumping:-

For the purpose of the above Order, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter, wait in or proceed along the following length of road:-

• **Drayton Road, Bletchley** – From its junction with Lomond Drive, continuing for a distance of 106 meters in a south westerly direction.

Whilst the above length of road is closed the alternative route will be via Lomond Drive, A4146 and Jersey Drive (and vice versa)

The above closure will start on 17th July 2021 and is scheduled to re-open on 18th July 2021 or until the said works have been completed Between 10:00pm and 5:00am, whichever is the sooner. Signs will be erected several days in advance to inform the public of the forthcoming closure.

The Council is satisfied that the temporary closure Order is necessary to enable works to be carried out on the highway. The temporary Order will come into effect on 17th July 2021 and remain in effect for a period of 3 months and will take effect at times during the above period **only** when works are required and **only** when indicated by the appropriate traffic signs, which will be erected in advance of any closure.

There will be no exemptions from the provisions of the proposed Order except for emergency service vehicles on operational duties and pedestrians.

The closures will be clearly signed in accordance with Chapter 8 of the Traffic Signs Manual. All affected properties will be notified of the forthcoming closures at least one week prior to works taking place.

Any person committing a breach of the order will be liable upon prosecution to such fine as is prescribed by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
