Isaac Maison GB World Dwarf Games Medalist

About Isaac Maison

Isaac lives in Bletchley and was born in 2007. He was diagnosed with Achondroplasia when he was 6 months old. Achondroplasia is a type of dwarfism whereby people have short upper limbs and enlarged heads. Isaac is one of two people ever to be born in Milton Keynes Hospital with Achondroplasia. The condition affects 1 in 40,000.

Despite his disability, Isaac has a love and ability for sport, which led him to become a member of the Dwarf Sports Association when he was just five years old, involving monthly Regional events and annual National events in Birmingham. The most memorable event was first National Games and they have approximately 200 competitors. Isaac was delighted to finally find other people just like him.

Up until the age of 13, Isaac was still taking part and playing in local team sports with average height children of the same age group. Isaac has always been determined not to allow his disability to prevent him from participating in sport.

Since Isaac became a member of the Dwarf Sport Association, he has won over 100 medals (most of them Gold) for various sporting activities at the National Games.

In 2017, Isaac was asked to represent Great Britain in Canada at the World Dwarf Games. Isaac returned home with 5 Gold medals, 1 Silver and 2 Bronze. Currently he is the U13 World Dwarf Champion in singles and doubles Badminton.

Isaac has now been recognised by Badminton England as a future Paralympian and has been selected for the GB Para Badminton pathway. This involves monthly training in Sheffield, one International competition per year and various Regional events throughout the year. As well as the above, Isaac trains for over 10 hours each week with a local Badminton Academy.

Isaac competed for the first time at the Spanish Para Badminton 2022 Tournament and came home with a bronze medal at just 14 for Men's doubles.

Fast forward to Summer 2023 and Isaac has exceeded all expectations! Isaac flew to Germany to represent GB at the World Dwarf Games in Germany in July 2023. Isaac won 9 medals, 2 Gold, 4 Silver and 3 Bronze. Isaac is now the Men's World Dwarf Champion in Singles Badminton at 15 years old !

One week later, Isaac flew to Rotterdam to represent Badminton England and managed to secure a bronze medal for Men's Singles Badminton. Isaac shared the podium with other players aged 32, 26 and 25!

The future looks very bright for Isaac and we wish him all the best with everything.









Bletchley and Fenny Stratford Town Council Residents' Survey 2023



Bletchley and Fenny Stratford Town Council consists of 21 councillors who are elected (or in some cases co-opted) to represent the local community. It is a statutory body which forms part of the first tier of local government. The town council is wholly independent of Milton Keynes City Council though we work with the city council and many other partner organisations. Our councillors are supported by a team of employees who implement the day-to-day work of the council.

Like all local councils, our work falls into three main categories:

• representing the local community

- delivering services to meet local needs
- working to improve community well-being and quality of life

and is funded by a tax known as a precept which is paid by local residents and is collected as part of the council tax.

We are asking you to give us your views about the services and support we provide to residents. This feedback is really important in helping councillors to decide the town council's priorities.

There are lots of services we cannot provide such as rubbish collections, schools, social care, planning, street lighting and road maintenance because these are all MKCC services. We will help where we can, but we cannot do this work ourselves. Our existing services include management of community centres, community events and specialist markets, Christmas lights, public toilets, allotments, youth clubs, holiday play schemes, CCTV cameras to deter and detect anti-social behaviour and many others. Recent feedback encouraged the council to take on landscaping maintenance and to provide warm spaces and money saving advice surgeries during the winter.

Organised football at Newton Leys

Bletchley and Fenny Stratford Town Council is delighted to announce that the football pitches alongside Newton Leys Pavilion have been transferred to the ownership of the town council. The pitches and changing rooms at the Pavilion are now being used for organised football. The town council has entered into an agreement with Tattenhoe Football Club allowing this club hire and use of the pitches and related facilities for the football season 2023-2024. We believe this club will provide excellent youth sporting opportunities for residents of Newton Leys and the wider Bletchley community, in a safe and well supervised environment.



We know the introduction of organised matches will mean changes for residents with additional usage of the Pavilion car park and an end to unrestricted dog walking on the land formerly owned by Taylor Wimpey. We are aiming to minimise disruption as far as possible. We are working with the football club to manage parking on match days and we encourage everyone visiting the pitches to use active transport or car sharing whenever possible. Existing use of the Pavilion will continue and we have now extended our CCTV coverage to include the football pitches as well as the car park.

Brand new affordable homes - Beacon Place



UK property developer Godwin Developments have agreed a forward funding deal with CBRE UK Affordable Housing Fund (AHF) to deliver 184 affordable homes in central Bletchley, Milton Keynes.

The four-acre scheme, named Beacon Place, will provide a mix of affordable and shared ownership properties, a combination of one and two-bed flats as well as 12 three-bedroom houses.

Beacon Place will cater to the growing demand for affordable homes in the area, especially from young people and families, seeking quality housing within commuting distance to employment opportunities.

Beacon Place is located adjacent to Bletchley station, and will have connections to London and across Oxfordshire and Cambridgeshire as a part of the developing East West Rail. For more information contact Godwin Developments.

Latest Update for the Town Deal



Milton Keynes

Milton Keynes City Council are continuing to make great progress in the delivery of their £22.7 million Town Deal regeneration programme, funded via the Government's Towns Fund. The funding is designed to capitalise on the emerging opportunities presented by the development of the Oxford to Cambridge East-West rail link, which connects to the Bletchley railway station.

The funding will deliver 9 regeneration projects across Bletchley & Fenny Stratford, focusing on addressing three key themes of: Regeneration, planning and land-use; Connectivity; and Skills and Enterprise.

Two of the schemes are now nearing practical completion. The first is the Transformation at Bletchley Park project, which through the Towns Fund and other funding secured by the Bletchley Park Trust, has helped in the regeneration and use of a significant wartime building (Block E). The second project, Tech Park at MK College, has helped provide new hardware and equipment for the newly constructed MK College Institute of Technology

building. Both these projects will help to support the growth of skills for the Town and upskilling of residents and students going forward.

The Redway project, which will provide new or improved Redway links between the Lakes Estate, Newton Leys and Blue Lagoon Nature Reserve to Bletchley Town centre, is now making great progress following mitigation to protect wildlife. The project is divided into 4 sections, with section 4 being delivered via the Towns Fund and sections 1 to 3 being delivered via several different funding streams. All sections are expected to be complete by Spring 2024.

Whilst some projects are nearing completion, the remaining are still in the development phase as MKCC and the Town Deal Board work on the emerging schemes. Progress is being made, including technical survey work and consultation will take place on several schemes in 2024. Details on any events will be provided to local residents and we look forward to sharing these projects with you.

Marston Vale Line News

Marston Vale Line train services are due to resume in late October.

Train services are due to resume on the Bletchley to Bedford Marston Vale Line in late October 2023. The three Class 150 (two carriage trains) which will serve the Marston Vale Line arrived at Bletchley Station from Newton Heath in July and technician training has been taking place. Each unit has an accessible toilet and can accommodate wheelchairs, buggies and cycles.

MK Food Bank

In 2022 MK Food Bank saw a 40% increase in demand for services – which worked out as more than 50 new households contacting the food bank every week.

2023 is showing no signs of slowing down. Unfortunately, the rising cost of food has also led to a drop in donations of food, which were down last year by nearly a third.

MK Food Bank have created a pledge fundraiser this year in order to support the community who are in food insecurity. They are asking you to commit to Drop Food, Drop Money or Drop Time to ensure no one goes hungry in Milton Keynes.

Fundraiser pledge examples:

- Run a sponsored 5k, 10k, half or full marathon
- Climb a mountain
- Get sponsored to walk 10,000 steps every day for a month
- Hold a team fundraising event a bake sale, dress up/down, raffle

What your fundraising could provide:

- £20 will pay for an emergency food parcel for a single adult
- £65 will feed a family of 4 for a week
- £100 will make up 20 family recipe kits

Water Eaton Community Larder

Bletchley and Fenny Stratford Town Council is in a 3 year partnership agreement with Water Eaton community larder. The larder have recently announced that they are now becoming Water Eaton Community Hub. The Hub will be an umbrella that will cover the Larder, the Soup for the Soul Café, and the support services that they offer. This will give the opportunity to expand the Larder by working with more food suppliers and manufacturers, enabling priority on environmental sustainability by reducing waste and promoting responsible practices.

The Soup for the Soul Café is a lovely place to meet people and to chat. The Cafe serves hot and cold drinks and a light lunch. There are also informative talks from services such as Citizens Advice, Diabetes UK, Stop Smoking, who provide information about the services they offer. Money Lifeline attend every week providing help for people in debt or financial crisis. *The Soup for the Soul Café is open on Tuesdays 1pm - 2pm.*

The Community Larder is a membership scheme that provides surplus food from the supermarkets that would otherwise go to waste and provides affordable access to healthy food every week. The Community Larder is not "means tested" and is therefore open to everyone.

It is £10 per year annual joining fee for the community larder, individual membership is from £3.50 per week and a family membership is from £7 per week.

An individual membership provides up to 10 items of non-perishables (pasta, tins, etc.) per week plus free fruit and vegetables. A family membership is twice as much.

The Water Eaton Community Larder is open on Tuesdays 2pm - 4pm.



It is hoped that in the future Sycamore Hall can be brought back into full use by the community and be modernised with improved disabled access.
