Bridge Repairs, H10 Bletcham Way / Simpson Road Canal Bridge, Mount Farm.

We will be carrying out essential maintenance work to the highway bridge carrying H10 Bletcham Way over the Grand Union Canal at Mount Farm.

The work will commence on 4th March until 21st June 2024.



The work, undertaken by our service provider Ringway, will include structural repairs, drainage, waterproofing and resurfacing. For safety reasons the work will be carried out in phases that require temporary road closures and lane closures with traffic light operation. During closure periods signed diversions will be in place.

The work will affect through-traffic using H10 Bletcham Way, and local traffic in Simpson Road, however there will also be occasional, minor restrictions applying to users of the redway over the bridge, and the canal towpath. Canal boat traffic will not be affected.

Road diversions and closures (to be confirmed)

Phase 1: H10 south verge and central reservation.

4th March – 24th May 2024:

Bletcham Way west-bound lane closure under 2-way traffic signal operation.

Peak-time delays can be expected in both directions.

Phase 2: H10 Bletcham Way carriageway, north verge, and south-side redway.

27th May – 21st June 2024 (estimated):

Bletcham Way closure between Fenny Lock Roundabout and Bond Avenue roundabout.

Signed traffic diversions will be implemented and advertised in advance.

Phase 3: Works to the supporting bridge piers – carried out from Simpson Road.

15th April – 2nd May 2024:

Simpson Road closure between Staplehall Road and Action4Youth Caldecotte Xperience (local residential access will be permitted).

Please note that the above time periods may be subject to amendment since the works are subject to favourable weather conditions. Every effort has been made to minimise disruption and we thank you for your patience whilst we improve our bridge infrastructure.
